SECTION 4 - FIRST AID MEASURES

* Not carcinogenic in rats or mice. Listed as Category 2A by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) but expert opinion based on weight of evidence is that classification as a carcinogen is not warranted.

TERATOGENICITY: For 2,4-D, laboratory tests have shown decreased fetal body weights at doses toxic to mother animals. For glyphosate, effects on offspring only noted with maternal toxicity.

MUTAGENICITY: No evidence of mutagenic effects during *in vivo* or *in vitro* studies.

SECTION 12 - ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION

ENVIRONMENTAL SUMMARY: Drift or runoff may adversely affect non-target plants. This pesticide may be toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present, or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Drift and runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters or rinsate. Apply this product only as directed on label.

This chemical has properties and characteristics associated with chemicals detected in groundwater. The use of this chemical in areas where soils are permeable, particularly where the water table is shallow, may result in groundwater contamination. FATE: 2,4-D IPA salt rapidly disassociates to the parent acid in the environment which very mobile in certain soil types. Typical half-life of the 2,4-D acid is from a few days to a few weeks.

Glyphosate rapidly disassociates to parent acid with a half-life and is relatively immobile in soil.
